PRACTICE DIRECTION 25

(Grenada)**

COURT CONNECTED MEDIATION –
JURIST PROJECT

This practice direction is made pursuant to Rule 4.2(2) of the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court (Civil Procedure) Rules, 2000.

1. Introduction

- 1.1 This Practice Direction shall be applicable only to matters scheduled under the Judicial Reform Pilot Project in Grenada.
- 1.2 This practice direction supplements Rule 25.1 and furthers the overriding objective by actively managing cases referred to mediation under the Project.

2. Context

- 2.1 In this Practice Direction—
- (1) “the Project” means the Judicial Reform Pilot Project designed for the reduction of the backlog of cases currently assessed as ready for trial but in respect of which no trial dates have been fixed or dates have been fixed for the years 2017 and beyond;
- (2) “mediation” means a flexible dispute resolution procedure in which a neutral third party facilitates negotiations between the parties to help them settle their dispute;
- (3) “mediation coordinator” means the person appointed to be responsible for the management of mediation sessions under the Project.

3. Mediation

- 3.1 All cases assigned to the Project, shall be referred to mediation notwithstanding that mediation has already occurred in some cases assigned to the Project.
- 3.2 Upon the making of a referral order by the Judge or Master, paragraphs 5 to 9 of Practice Direction No. 1 of 2003 “Court Connected Mediation” shall apply, unless modified by this Practice Direction.
- 3.3 At the end of the mediation session the mediator shall immediately complete a Notice of Outcome of Mediation form and lodge the same with the mediation coordinator, no later than one day after the conclusion of mediation proceedings.

3.4 On the lodgment of the Notice of Outcome of Mediation, the court shall make a resulting order within three days.

3.5 The mediation coordinator shall schedule four mediation sessions a day until the quota of assigned cases has been completed.

4. Effective Date

4.1 This Practice Direction will come into effect on the 6th day of February, 2015.
